


PRINCIPLES OF FORCE SCIENCE/ EMPHASIS ON BODY-WORN CAMERAS

Dr. Lewinski is one of the world's leading behavioral scientists whose work has focused primarily on the intensive study of the human dynamics involved in high stress, life- threatening encounters. He has a Ph.D. in Police Psychology and is a professor emeritus of Law Enforcement at Minnesota State University, Mankato, where he taught for more than 28 years. In 2003 he was named Distinguished Professor of the Year for the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences. He is a professor of negotiations at the University of Padua in Italy. He is the founder and director the Force Science® Institute, Ltd. (FSI), which is a research, consulting and training organization focused primarily on human behavior in use-of-force situations.



Dr. Lewinski's research has looked at subject and officer movement in lethal force encounters, action/reaction parameters, perception and memory. His ground-breaking findings have been presented at peer-reviewed conferences in psychology, criminal justice and engineering. They have also been published in national law enforcement publications, websites, e-newsletters and have been discussed in peer-reviewed publications. Additionally, his work was highlighted on Daily Planet, a televised program on the Discovery Channel Canada, 48 Hours Investigates, and a BBC Panorama special program, When Cops Kill. Dr. Lewinski's studies involve technologically sophisticated investigations into the perceptual and psychological factors that impact an officer's perception, reaction and memory in lethal force encounters. One study involved a collaborative effort with the University of Calgary and police services in the United Kingdom to determine the relationship of focal vision to information processing judgment and accuracy of shot placement in lethal force encounters.

Dr. Lewinski is an extremely popular speaker and consultant who has presented to and. worked with a diverse span of groups, ranging internationally from the British House of Commons and House of Lords to the London Metropolitan Police, New Scotland Yard, Police Service of Northern Ireland, Republic of Ireland Police, I.A.C.P., and domestically from the FBI and other major law enforcement organizations to local police departments. He has presented at more than 100 international, national and regional conferences and has conducted more than 150 training classes and seminars worldwide. His audiences have represented a vast array of professionals, including investigators, attorneys, administrators, internal affairs personnel, and civilian review groups.



PARKLAND FL SHOOTING REVEW & LESSONS LEARNED



Col. (ret.) Jack Dale Broward Co. Sheriff's Office (FL)



On February 14th, 2018 a former student of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida arrived on campus armed with a rifle. He proceeded to shoot and kill 17 students and school staff members while leaving another 17 wounded. This tragic event is the deadliest shooting at a high school in US history. In the aftermath of the incident, there has been a great deal of scrutiny concerning the response of first responders, 911 call routing, radio interoperability, school security, threat assessment, mental health services and active shooter policy and training. The event prompted state legislation providing for risk protection orders, enhanced school security and the purchase of rifles by those under the age of 21.

This presentation provided by Col. (ret.) Jack Dale of the Broward Co. Sheriff's Office (FL) will cover the history of the shooter, a chronology of the event, lessons learned and actions taken post-incident. Col. Dale began his law enforcement career in 1989 and served with the Fort Lauderdale Police Department and the Broward Sheriff's Office. He has experience in the areas of uniformed patrol, narcotics investigations, criminal investigations, SWAT, training and internal affairs. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Public Management and Masters degree in Leadership, and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and FBI National Executive Institute.

As the commander with the Broward Sheriff's Office's Department of Investigations and the Department of Professional Standards during mass shootings at both the Fort Lauderdale International Airport and the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School, he was charged with the post incident analysis and oversight of the team responsible for corrective action implementation.

Hannah now leads seminars on social media crisis communication, social media and grief, social media strategy, and how to move forward when tragedy strikes.

Det./Lt. Gerald Habanek Waukesha Police Dept. (WI)

Jerry has been with the Waukesha Police Department for 25 years. Currently, he is assigned to the Criminal Investigations Division as the Early Shift Commander. Previously, he supervised Sensitive Crimes, Computer Forensics and Internet Crimes Against Children. He obtained a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He holds Instructor certifications from the State of Wisconsin Bureau of Training and Standards related to Criminal Investigation and sits on the Criminal Investigation Advisory Board for the State of Wisconsin.



Det. Thomas Casey Waukesha Police Dept. (WI)

Thomas Casey is a Detective with the Waukesha Police Department and has worked at there for over twenty years. The past 6.5 years he has been a Detective where he has investigated crimes ranging from financial crimes to homicides and he specializes in death investigations. He is the department trainer for death investigations. Tom holds a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He graduated Suma Cum Laude. He has attended the Saint Louis University School of Medicine - Medicolegal Death Investigator course and numerous other death investigating training classes. Tom was the first Detective on scene and assigned the lead investigator of the Slenderman case. He has worked this case from the day it occurred throughout the judicial process.



Det. Michelle Trussoni Waukesha Police Dept. (WI)

Michelle has been with the Waukesha Police Department for 18 years. She is currently assigned to the Narcotics and Vice Unit, and was previously assigned to Waukesha North High School as an SRO for four years. Michelle was on duty the day the 12-year-old girls stabbed their classmate and interviewed one of the suspects, Anissa Weier.case. She has worked this case from the day it occurred throughout the judicial process.

A remote attendant verifies and approves every transaction through three high-res cameras in real time. The cameras also capture multiple images of the sellers which are included on the transaction report.



SCREENS PHONES FOR ACTIVE KILL SWITCH

Some manufacturers have introduced software to disable stolen phones. If the kiosk detects such a "kill switch," it will reject the transaction unless the user is able to deactivate it.



CAPTURES SERIAL NUMBER & DEVICE PHOTOS

The ecoATM® kiosk electronically extracts the serial number (IMEI, MEID, etc.) for each phone if technically possible. Images of the device are included on the transaction report.



ID VALIDATOR

A valid government-issued ID is required for every transaction. Photos of the actual ID are captured and added to every transaction report.

A valid thumbprint is captured and included in the transaction report where required by law.






